Nestern Europe. Travelers will only be granted entry to Peru if they present to the immigration official with a passport valid for at least six months. Citizens of Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Chile, Ecuador, Argentina, Paraguay, and Uruguay can enter with their national identification document. Venezuelan citizens must have a passport and visa to enter Peru. Maximum authorized stay is 183 days. Longer and non-tourist stays (residence, study, work, etc.) visas must be requested in advance at a Peruvian Consulate in the country of origin.
