



A multicultural city

Throughout its history Lima has been spurred on by migration from around the world and from other regions of the country. One could say that many bloodlines course her veins. Multiculturalism is her principal capital.

> Lima is home to the largest Chinese population and the second largest nikkei community in Latin America.



Every Lima Politically, Lima refers to a region, a province, a city: Metropolitan Lima, and a district. Greater Lima includes 43 districts (divided into Lima North, South, East, Central).

History

An ancient city

Caral, the continent's oldest civilization, arose 5000 years ago. Since that time, different Pre-Inca cultures have occupied the land that is today Lima. With the arrival of the Incas and later the Spaniards, the landscape became speckled with the *huacas*, churches, and monuments that today make up the historical patchwork that is our capital city.

The huaca trail

Modern buildings side-by-side with more than 300 archaeological sites. Be sure to visit these three:

Huallamarca (200 BC)

This archaeological monument has the shape of a truncated pyramid and houses more than 70 funeral bundles.

Was the most important archaeological site on the central coast.




Public spaces

Consisting of the Juana Alarco de Dammert, Exposition, and Reserve parks, this green corridor is home to the Museum of Italian Art, the Lima Art Museum, and the Magical Water Circuit. It is located between blocks 1 and 8 of the Vía Expresa.

• Barrio Chino

The table where it all comes together



Lima is the meeting point for all Peru, a melting pot of cuisines enriched by the historical flow of migrants and products from other regions of the country and from overseas. If it were to be represented in a single image, it would that of a huge pantry filled with fresh products, many of them impossible to find in other countries. This variety of products is the secret to the success of what is now the Gastronomic Capital of the Americas. The table is set, so take a seat.





•• — The huge pantry

Lima brings together in one exquisite metropolis, all of Peru's enormous biodiversity: lemons from the north used in ceviche; the giant corn of Cusco to accompany anticuchos (meat skewers); innumerable native potatoes of all colors and textures. Chili peppers are the pillars of its taste. Grains such as quinoa and kiwicha (amaranth) are super foods in vogue around the world. Coffee and cocoa make city life more tolerable. There are exotic Amazon fruits and aromatic Andean spices. Spirited Pisco is now all the rage in London and New

York. And of course, the ocean. What would Lima's cuisine be without seafood and the artisanal fisher?

What's more: what would our cuisine be like without the chefs, custodians and creators of taste? These men and women are compilers of a ancestral gastronomic history; creators of new trends and tastes. The are innovative revolutionaries capable of bringing everyone together around the same table.

Lima is like that—the huge reserve of knowledge and taste for an entire country.

Textiles. Jewels. Ceramics. The essence and products of a diverse country, in the window displays of Lima.

As with its cuisine, almost everything that is made in Peru can be found in Lima Those interested in jewelry will find beautiful items of gold and silver, precious metals that have been valued since Pre-Inca times and which became world famous during the Peruvian vice royalty in colonial times.

Textile lovers can try on modern designs made with pima cotton, a variety brought from Egypt at the beginning of the 20th century and adapted to the soil and climate of the coast, to become a flagship product

of Peru. To say nothing of the auquénido fibers, previously worn only by Inca nobles. Amongst these, vicuña fiber is the finest: one kilo can cost more than US\$ 500.

Finally, Lima has come to welcome the knowledge of the great craftsman whose works with wood, metal, or ceramic have become true icons in the collective local imagination: the Pucará bulls and Chulucanas ceramics are today flagship products of Peru.

Fashion

With tradition that encourages inspiration and materials high in value, Peru's textile Industry offers the world of fashion its manufacturing excellence. Peruvian fashion

is making its way in the world and experts predict that the impact will be as formidable as that achieved by the national cuisine now on the tip of everyone's tongue.

Jewelry

Peru is one of the world's principal gold and silver producers and, since the time of the Incas, has been recognized for the its excellent use of these precious metals. The pieces that Peruvian artisans and jewelers produce combine talent with original techniques and design, inspired by the past, yet at the same time distinctly modern. These are items that today are admired for their symbolism and perfection.

Design

Over the last three decades the contemporary craftsmanship and design gallery-shop concept has emerged in Lima. These are places where you can find original Peruvian items of artisanship, accessories and jewelry. In some cases shopping here

is like visiting a museum, or taking a tour of Peruvian craftsmanship. In other cases, on offer is the chance to obtain exclusive handcrafted artistic, decorative, and utilitarian items.

PERÚ MODA has been held since **1998**, an event that brings together the best of Peruvian export products in apparel, footwear, jewelry, decoration articles and gift. *perumoda.com



Callao

The historic port

Pre-Inca people settled this area and dedicated themselves to fishing. It was the principal naval station in South America during the Viceroyalty in the 16th and 17th centuries and resisted attacks by Dutch and English pirates. In 1857 it was granted the status of Constitutional Province. Its streets, lined by churches, mansions with balconies, and a fortress against pirates, pay tribute to the history of the country.

The port hub

The country's most important port is a hub for the region. In 2015 it moved more than 1900 thousand TEU (CEPAL), the 6th highest in Latin America. Of the cargo exported by Peru, some 90% leaves from the port. It is strategically divided into two terminals: North, operated by APM Terminals, and South, by DP World.

La Punta

One day

Tour the historic center in the morning; traverse it's plazas and visit the capital's main churches and the Barrio Chino.

Lunch at a restaurant that features on the list of the world's top 50, enjoying a tasty menu. Make a reservation, naturally.

Watch the setting sun as you stroll along the Miraflores cliff walk. Enjoy a pisco sour looking out over the Pacific at one of Larcomar's bars or restaurants.



Two days

Discouer the history and art of monumental Callao and breathe in the atmosphere of the principal port of Peru.

Taste a ceviche beside the sea and in the afternoon take a cruise to the marine life refuges located on islands located along the Callao coast.

Dedicate the second day to a tour of the streets of Miraflores. Here you will be able to find beautiful alpaca garments and silver jewelry. Finally, go paragliding and admire the city from above.



A weekend

Discover the site where the first city in the Americas was carved out: Caral. View the pyramids and be surprised by the world's oldest quipu.

Lunch in the center of Lima and spend an afternoon shopping in San Isidro.

Savor shrimp at Lunahuaná as you have fun rafting on the river. Or visit a vineyard to learn about the production of Pisco, and the distilled beverage born in the eponymous port during the 16th century.

The image of Saint Peter, patron of fishermen, is carried in procession through Chorrillos and Callao accompanied by trays of ocean food and floral arrangements in memory of fishermen lost at sea.

National Day

The national day festival in Lima brings together all the xpressions of a diverse country looking towards its upcoming bicentenary (in 2021). Parades of school children and the Great Military Parade are highlights.

Anniversary of the Founding of Lima

During commemoration of the creation of the City of Kings by Francisco Pizarro in 1535, the Serenade to Lima takes place in the Main Square, in the midst of a festival of lights and fireworks.

Mistura


